Elevation of the Earth's surface with a pointed summit and steep slopes.

Flat expanse of land.

### **DEPRESSION**


Area in the land surface situated below sea level.



# Language Learning Plateau



- A learning plateau refers to a period in the learning process where progress appears to stall, and no further improvement is seen despite continued effort and practice.
- Approximately 64% of language learners report experiencing plateaus in their learning journey according to a survey by FluentU.

- Inadequate feedback
- Inconsistent study habits
- Lack of specific goals

- Set specific goals
- Explore different learning methods

- Enjoy the learning process

3	Grammatical range and accuracy (grammar and structure)	Attempts to use complex structures!	Extensive reading and listening.  Do grammar exercises.
4	Cohesion and coherence (organization)	Not following the paragraph structure	Follow the paragraph structure.
	Others	Typos Margin Font size Names – REAL names without titles	Be more attentive!
